A case study of a hospital chief executive officer

Coaching is increasingly prevalent in today's organization. The past twelve years has produced numerous articles, journals, books and research documenting the practice and effectiveness of coaching.

This case presentation explores the value of coaching for the leader and ultimately the organization. Understanding one's own impact from the perspective of others may seem intuitive or even insignificant, yet it is the singular most important learning anyone in a leadership position can gain in a coaching relationship. This perspective is relayed from both the client's feedback and the coach's reflection throughout their work together and how the ICF coaching competencies support the process.

Diane will also speak to her coaching work with leaders and teams in organizations including the National Aeronautic and Space Administration (NASA) with 4-D Systems and Dr. Charlie Pellerin, author of *How NASA Builds Teams*. She will share an overview of this work and the synergy with coaching.

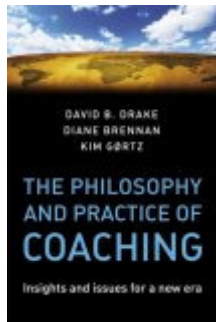

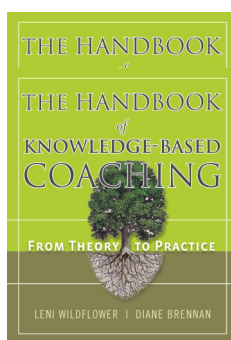

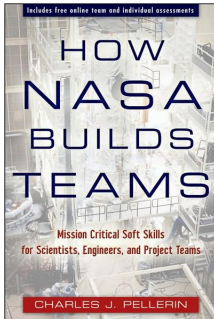
