# Definition of mentoring?

# What is mentoring?

## Mentoring Is...

✓ **Development Tool** - It is a development program that grows knowledge, networks, and careers. The process allows more experienced employees to support and develop other HIPO employees.

✓ **Knowledge Sharing Opportunity** - It is a process that improves cross-functional knowledge sharing and facilitates the flow of information and ideas throughout the organization.

✓ **Organizational Culture Enhancer** - It can help employees better understand the organization's operations, policies, and culture.

## Mentoring Is NOT...

✗ **Guarantee of Promotion** - A mentoring relationship provides no assurance of promotion or increase in compensation. However, both parties may develop competencies and skills that improve overall job performance.

✗ **Management Replacement** - The mentor should not take on the responsibilities of the mentee's manager.

✗ **Employee Assistance Program** - Mentoring is not an employee assistance program that provides employees with counseling on personal issues.

# Mentoring and Coaching differ

Mentoring	Coaching
Helps facilitate a culture of growth and development within the organization	Assesses and improves an individual's performance in a particular area
Concentrates on the individual's development needs and goals based on his/her career aspirations	Concentrates on identified issues with clear goals to develop specific skills and behaviors
Mutually benefits both the mentor and mentee	Disproportionately benefits the person being coached
Builds a long-term relationship dependent upon participants' performance through various career stages	Sets a time-bound relationship defined to meet specific goals and objectives
The mentor shares his/her experiences, opinion and view with the mentee	Coach do not share their views in only releases own views and possibilities of the client

# Benefits for the Mentee

- ✓ Have exposure and visibility to senior leadership
- ✓ Receive encouragement (which in turn increases their motivation and self confidence)
- ✓ Acquire knowledge and professional skills
- ✓ Save time by learning shortcuts and strategies that are normally learned by trial and error
- ✓ Get one on one feedback from someone other than their immediate manager
- ✓ Demonstrate what they know to various audiences, having another input in the talent review process, from the mentor
- ✓ Gain important personal contacts, increasing their network

# Benefits for the Mentor

- ✓ Increase their mentoring skills, which they can use in numerous areas of their lives
- ✓ Learn new technical knowledge and skills
- ✓ Increase their professional network as they interact with other mentors, mentees, managers, and others
- ✓ Demonstrate their ability (to superiors and colleagues) to recognize and develop new talent
- ✓ Gain tremendous satisfaction from contributing to the development of capable individuals
- ✓ Many mentors gain fresh enthusiasm for their own careers in the process

# Benefits for the Organization

- ✓ New colleagues can adapt to Avon culture earlier
- ✓ Growing loyalty and engagement

- ✓ Providing opportunities to develop skills

# Expectations for Partnering

- ✓ Accept the relationship on a temporary basis, 6-12 months
- ✓ Establish specific goals to be achieved during this time period
- ✓ Have regular meetings (The mentor's calendar will probably set the pace.)
- ✓ The minimum to keep the relationship productive seems to be one or two hours per month, but pairs can meet more often, than that.
- ✓ Face to face meetings can be replaced with phone meetings
- ✓ Keep any commitments made
- ✓ Keep confidences between each other
- ✓ Evaluate the relationship at various points within the agreed upon time frame
- ✓ Considering what they've accomplished and what next steps to take

# Tips: How to be a good mentor/mentee

- ✓ Take the initiative
- ✓ Respect your partner`s time
- ✓ Be clear about your needs and expectations
- ✓ Always ask whether you can make a suggestion or give feedback
- ✓ Consider all advice you receive
- ✓ Show that you have used the advice you have received
- ✓ Be thankful for assistance
- ✓ Don`t talk negatively about your partner to others
- ✓ Maintain confidentiality
- ✓ Be prepared to end the relationship once it has served its purpose

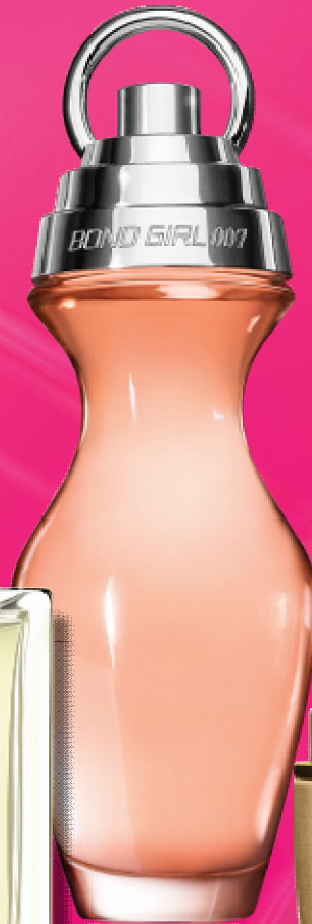
